No breakthrough in terror attack on IAF convoy, search ops intensified in Poonch Jammu: A breakthrough Sheendara top for the third day

luded the security forces in the Poonch terrorist attack on a convoy of Indian Air Force even as a massive search operation in a vast area of the Jammu and Kashmir district entered the third day on Monday, officials said. More than 20 persons were detained for questioning as the security forces are gathering clues to neutralise the terrorists who fled into nearby dense forests after carrying out the ambush near Shahsitar in Surankote area on Saturday evening. Five IAF personnel were injured in the attack and one of them later succumbed to injuries at a military hospital. The officials said a massive joint search operation by army and police is in progress in several areas including Shahsitar. Gursai, Sanai, Lasana and been detained by the police for questioning, while massive Cordon and Search Operation (CASO) contin-

rorists so far. The security agencies are collecting clues which will ultimately help flush out the terrorists, they said.
